

Sisler's Kozak Wins Harry Hood Trophy

Jerry Kozak of the champion Sisler Spartans has been selected 1963 winner of the Harry Hood Memorial Trophy, it was announced today.

The award is presented annually to the high school football player judged the best in combining playing ability with school citizenship and academic achievement.

Won last year by Jerry Novak of Tech-Voc Hornets, the trophy is awarded to perpetuate the memory of Harry Hood, a student and football player at Kelvin who went on to professional fame with Winnipeg Blue Bombers and Calgary Stampeders.

This year's winner is a three-year veteran with the team. A two-way end, Kozak was one of the champions' team leaders and co-captains. Besides being a fine football player, he is considered a good all around athlete.

Last year he represented Sisler in varsity basketball, volleyball, curling and track and field. During one of the indoor meets last year, he was selected outstanding athlete of the meet, excelling in high jumping.

Jerry is a member of the school's athletic council, vice-president of the curling league, coaches a junior high

softball team and referees intramural games.

During Sisler's commencement exercises this fall, Kozak was presented with the

school's merit award for physical education.
