

Sisler player honored

For the fifth time in nine years Sisler Spartans have produced a football player who best exemplifies the highest standard of playing ability, academic achievement, school citizenship, and sportsmanship.

David Kraemer has been named the Harry Hood Memorial Trophy winner for the 1978 Winnipeg High School Football League season. A \$100 bursary accompanies the trophy.

Kraemer participated in all sports available to him at Sisler High School. He was an organizer and referee, played bantam football with North Winnipeg Nomads, and last year was named assistant referee-in-chief for the North Winnipeg Minor Hockey Association. He also officiated at volleyball and basketball games.

Kraemer was Sisler team captain for the past two years and proved his versatility by playing on both offence and defence.

"David is an individual who stands out in a group of 1,300 students because of his ability to lead, his dedication to school commitments and his over-all contribution as an outstanding personality at Sisler," said vice-principal Lou Mainella.
